Jewellery such as necklaces, bracelets or dangling earrings should not be worn. Appropriate footwear should always be worn. Protective gloves to be worn on the helping hand when appropriate. The Forest Leader will model this. All tools to be stored correctly when not being used. If available, tools to have a protective guard attached to them. When being transported to the site, tools to be in a secure container. If the weight of the box is unmanageable for one person, then two people must carry it or it should be on a trolley, refer to HA001.1 Bushcraft Manual Handling RA Tools will be counted in and out. Hazard: Poor maintenance of tools Risk: Cuts & bleeding	Staff Participants General Public	 All tools to be checked prior to being used. If a tool is broken whilst being used, the session leader should be informed so the tool can be removed. Damaged tools to be marked and stored separately. Hazard: Safe area for tool use Risk: Injury to self and others	Staff Participants General Public	 A safe area should be clearly marked for tool use. Only the participant and the qualified adult should enter the safe tool use area. At the end of the session all trace should be removed. Risk: Cuts, bleeding, injury to self & others	Staff Participants General Public	 Participants will be told and shown how to hold the saw safely, and the object being cut. Participants to be told and shown how to hold the saw safely whilst standing or walking. Ensure hands are dry when using the saw. Participants to wear a rigger glove on their helping hand. The blade should be checked for debris and carefully cleaned after use. When not in use the blade cover should be replaced. Hazard: Bill Hook Risk: Cuts, bleeding,	Staff Participants General Public	 Participants will be told and shown how to hold the bill hook safely, and the object being cut. Participants will only use the bill hook if the session leader thinks they are confident enough. Participants to be told and shown how to hold the bill hook safely whilst standing or walking. Ensure hands are dry when using the bill 	Full briefing given before session starts	Trained member of staff	Pre session starting	

injury to self & others		 hook. Gloves should NOT be worn when using the bill hook to ensure the tool or hand does not slip. When not in use the bill hook must be stored safely away in the tool area. 				
Hazard: Hand drill / Carpenters Brace Risk: Cuts, bleeding, injury to self & others	Staff Participants General Public	 Participants will be told and shown how to hold the hand drill safely, and the object being drilled. Participants to be told and shown how to hold the hand drill safely whilst standing or walking. Participants will only use the hand drill under the supervision of the session leader if they are deemed to be ready. Ensure hands are dry when using the hand drill. When not in use the hand drill must be stored safely away in the tool area. 	Full briefing given before session starts	Trained member of staff	Pre session starting	
Hazard: Mallet / hammer Risk: Injury to self & others	Staff Participants General Public	 Participants will be told and shown how to hold the mallet, and the object being hit. Participants to be told and shown how to hold the mallet whilst standing or walking. Ensure hands are dry when using the mallet. 	Full briefing given before session starts	Trained member of staff	Pre session starting	

Risk: Cuts, bleeding, injury to self & others	Staff Participants General Public	 Participants will only use the bush craft knife under the supervision of the session lead if they are deemed to be ready. The session leader has the right to refuse the use of a knife by a participant if it is deemed unsafe. Participants will be shown safe positions to sit and hold their body. Participants will be told and shown how to hold the bush craft knife safely, and the object being cut. The bush craft knife should be securely placed in its sheath when standing or walking. Ensure hands are dry when using the knife. Participants to wear a rigger glove on their helping hand. Never leave the knife unattended on the ground, always place in its sheath when not in use. Knives must be returned to the tool area and placed in a locked box when not in use. 	Full briefing given before session starts	Trained member of staff	Pre session starting	
Hazard: Secateurs	Staff Participants General Public	 Participants will be told and shown how to hold the secateurs safely, and the object being cut. Risk: Cuts, bleeding, injury to self & others		 Ensure hands are dry when using the secateurs. Participants to wear a rigger glove on their helping hand. The blade should be checked for debris and carefully cleaned after use. When not in use the safety clip should be replaced. 				
Hazard: Flint & Steel Risk: Burns, potential forest fire	Staff Participants General Public	 Flint and Steel only to be used in the location of the fire circle. Only one participant to use the flint and steel ant any one time. The session leader to supervise at all times. Participants will be taught to use the flint and steel safely in the briefing and the session leader will model how to strike it safely. The flint and steel will be transported in the palm of the hand and not swung around. It must never be thrown. Once the flint and steel has been used it must be returned to the tool box. Flammable clothes such as fancy dress costumes are not allowed in the fire circle. The session leader will decide if a participant is ready to use the flint and steel confidently, taking into account their maturity, dexterity and experience. Participants to be told and shown how to hold the tools safely whilst standing or walking. Participants only to use gardening tools under the supervision of a qualified adult. Ensure hands are dry when using the tools. After use the gardening tools should be returned and stored safely.
